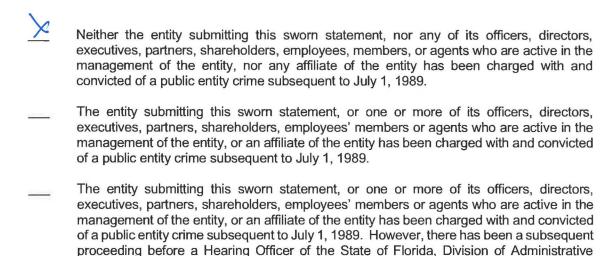

#### NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS Years Ended December 31, 2023 and 2022

#### A. Nature of Business and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies:

#### Nature of Business

The Company is a general contractor engaged primarily in the earth moving phases of the construction industry for developers and government agencies. The Company is located in St. Augustine, Florida and their principal market area is in the North Florida. The work is performed under fixed-priced contracts. The length of each contract varies but is typically less than one year.

#### Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

<u>Use of Estimates</u> - Management uses estimates and assumptions in preparing these financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Those estimates and assumptions affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities, and the reported revenues and expenses. Actual results could vary from the estimates that were used.

Revenue and Cost Recognition - The construction of site development, roadways, and underground utilities is a single performance obligation that is satisfied over time. Payment is also due over time in installments, based on project phases as specified in the contract, with final payment due at the time the construction is completed, and the customer accepts final work.

Company recognizes revenues from fixed-price, modified fixed-price, and cost-plus-fee long-term construction contracts using the cost-to-cost input method, which measures progress toward completion based on the percentage of costs incurred to date to total estimated costs for each contract. That method is used because management considers total cost to be the best available measure of progress on the contracts. Because of inherent uncertainties in estimating costs, it is at least reasonably possible that estimates used will change within the near term.

Contract costs include all direct material and labor costs and those indirect costs related to contract performance, such as indirect labor, supplies, tools, repairs, and depreciation. Costs incurred to obtain a contract are expensed, as they are not incremental and would be incurred whether or not a contract is obtained. Provisions for estimated losses on uncompleted contracts are made in the period in which such losses are determined. Changes in job performance, job conditions, and estimated profitability may result in revisions to costs and income, which are generally recognized in the period in which the revisions are determined.

# NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS Years Ended December 31, 2023 and 2022 -continued-

#### A. Nature of Business and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued):

Revenue and Cost Recognition (continued) - Changes in estimated job profitability resulting from variable consideration (such as incentives for completing a contract early or on time, penalties for not completing a contract on time, claims for which the Company has enforceable rights, or contract modifications/change orders in which the scope of modification has been approved, but the price has not been determined or approved) are accounted for as changes in estimates in the current period but limited to an amount that will not result in a significant reversal of revenue in future periods.

The timing of revenue recognition, billings and cash collections result in contract assets and liabilities on the balance sheet. Amounts are billed as work progresses in accordance with agreed-upon contractual terms, either at periodic intervals or upon achievement of contractual milestones. Generally, billing occurs subsequent to revenue recognition. Contracts in which revenues recognized exceed amounts billed have the balance included in the current assets. Contracts in which billings exceed revenues recognized have the balance included in current liabilities.

Revenues from construction work performed under time-and-material contracts are determined by a percentage mark-up on actual labor and material costs incurred. Unbilled revenues, if any, are accrued and included as unbilled contract receivables for time-and-material and unit price contracts.

<u>General and Administrative Expenses</u> - These expenses are charged to operations as incurred and are not allocated to contract costs.

<u>Inventories</u> - <u>Inventories</u> consist of construction materials and supplies that have not been charged to specific contracts and are stated at the lower of cost, (first-in, first-out) and net realizable value.

## NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS Years Ended December 31, 2023 and 2022 -continued-

#### A. Nature of Business and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued):

<u>Property, Equipment, and Depreciation</u> - Depreciation is computed by declining balance methods based on the estimated useful lives of the individual units of furniture, office equipment and vehicles and by the straight-line method for construction equipment. The election to expense assets is used for tax purposes when applicable. The following is the estimated useful lives:

Office furniture and equipment - 5 to 10 years Vehicles and transportation equipment - 5 years Construction equipment - 5 to 10 years

Long-lived assets held and used by the Company are reviewed for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount for an asset may not be recoverable. In the event the facts and circumstances indicate that the cost of any long-lived assets may be impaired, an evaluation of recoverability would be performed following generally accepted accounting principles.

<u>Income Taxes</u> - The Corporation has elected under Subchapter S of the Internal Revenue Code. As a result, the shareholders report the entire federal corporate taxable income on their individual tax returns.

<u>Uncertain Tax Positions</u> - The Company is required to recognize, measure, classify and disclose in the financial statements uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken in the Company's tax returns. The Company's evaluation revealed no uncertain tax positions that would have a material impact on the financial statements.

Statement of Cash Flows - For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Company considers all highly liquid debt instruments purchased with a maturity of three months are less to be cash equivalents. Cash paid for interest was \$122,820 and \$81,690 for the year ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, respectively. Cash paid for income taxes was \$-0- for the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022. Noncash interest expense attributable to accreted interest for capital leases on new construction equipment was \$1,091 and \$-0- for the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, respectively.

<u>Fair Value of Financial Instruments</u> - Unless otherwise indicated, the fair values of all reported assets and liabilities that represent financial instruments (none of which are held for trading purposes) approximate the carrying value uses of such amounts.

# NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS Years Ended December 31, 2023 and 2022 -continued-

#### A. Nature of Business and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued):

<u>Compensated Absences</u> - Employees of the Company were entitled to paid vacation depending on job classification, length of service, and other factors. No liability has been recorded in the accompanying financial statements due to immaterially. The Company's policy is to recognize costs of compensated absences when actually paid to employees.

Consideration of Credit Risk - The Company maintains a majority of its cash balances in financial institutions located in St. Augustine, Florida. The balances, all deposit accounts, including checking and savings accounts, money market deposit accounts and certificates of deposit, are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation up to \$250,000 per customer. At times, deposits may exceed federally insured limits. At December 31, 2023, the Company exceeded the insured limit by approximately \$1,077,000.

<u>Contract Receivables and Related Allowance for Credit Losses</u> - Contract receivables are recorded when invoices are issued and are presented on the balance sheet before the allowance for credit losses. Contract receivables are written off when they are determined to be uncollectible. The allowance for credit losses is estimated based on the expected credit losses considering the Company's historical losses, the existing economic conditions in the construction industry, the financial stability of its customers, and macroeconomic factors. The Company periodically assesses its methodologies for estimating credit losses in consideration of actual experiences, trends, and changes in the overall economic environment.

<u>Contract Bid Costs</u> - The Company incurs costs related to proposing for and negotiating terms of construction contracts. These activities generally include initial design costs. These costs are not explicitly chargeable to the customer, even if the Company obtains the contract. The Company charges all such costs to expense, regardless of whether it is successful in obtaining a contract. Bids costs are not incremental because they would be incurred whether or not a contract is obtained. Under GAAP, only incremental costs of obtaining a contract may be deferred and amortized over the expected period of recovery.

<u>Leases</u> - The determination of whether an arrangement is a lease is made at the lease's inception. Under ASC 842, a contract is (or contains) a lease if it conveys the right to control the use of an identified asset for a period of time in exchange for consideration. Control is defined under the standard as having both the right to obtain substantially all of the economic benefits from use of the asset and the right to direct the use of the asset. Management only reassesses its determination if the terms and conditions of the contract are changed.

## NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS Years Ended December 31, 2023 and 2022 -continued-

#### A. Nature of Business and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued):

#### Leases (continued) -

Operating leases are included in operating lease right-of-use ("ROU") assets, other current liabilities and operating lease liabilities on the balance sheets. Finance leases are included in property and equipment, other current liabilities, and other long-term liabilities on the balance sheets.

ROU assets represent the Company's right to use an underlying asset for the lease term, and lease liabilities represent our obligation to make lease payments. Operating lease ROU assets and liabilities are recognized at the lease commencement date based on the present value of lease payments of the lease term. The Company uses the implicit rate when it is readily determinable. Since most of the Company's leases do not provide an implicit rate, management uses the Company's incremental borrowing rate based on the information available at lease commencement. Operating lease ROU assets also include any lease payment made and excludes any lease incentives. Lease expense for lease payments is recognized on a straight-line basis over the lease term. The Company's lease terms may include options to extend or terminate the lease when it is reasonably certain that the Company will exercise the option.

The Company has lease agreements with lease and non-lease components, which are generally accounted for separately with amounts allocated to the lease and non-lease components based on stand-alone prices. For certain equipment leases, the Company accounts for the lease and non-lease components as a single lease. Lease payments for leases with a term of 12 months or less are expensed on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease with no lease asset or liability recognized. Rent expense for equipment was \$43,415 and \$4,644 for the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, respectively. Rent expense for the building was \$142,668 for the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022.

<u>Date of Management's Review</u> - Subsequent events have been evaluated through March 25, 2024, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

#### F. Notes Payable:

<u>Installment</u> - The Company has twenty-eight installment notes payable secured by various equipment with financial entities bearing interest from -0- to 9.99% and requiring principal payments of \$963,641 plus interest for the upcoming year.

<u>Promissory Note</u> - On December 21, 2023, the Company initiated a promissory note, with AgGeorgia Farm Credit, in the amount of \$715,470. The promissory note has a term of 20 years, and bears a fixed rate of 8.97%, requiring monthly payments of \$6,422. The note is secured by land and guaranteed by the stockholder.

<u>Line of Credit</u> – On September 19, 2022 the Company initiated a line of credit, with Ameris Bank, for \$900,000, requiring monthly installments of principal and interest on any outstanding balance. The line of credit will expire on December 19, 2024, at which point, any outstanding principal and interest is due. The line of credit bears a rate of Prime plus 0.50%, and not less than 6.00% per annum. The note is secured by company assets and guaranteed by the stockholder. At December 31, 2023, the outstanding balance of the line of credit was \$-0-.

The lease was renewed on January 1, 2023 for an additional three-years. The Company is responsible for real estate taxes the reminder of the lease. The rent paid was \$142,668 in 2023 and in 2022. Also, the Company paid the associated premises' real estate taxes in the amounts of \$12,057 and \$7,816 for 2023 and 2022, respectively.

#### I. Retirement Plan:

On September 24, 2018 a SIMPLE IRA Retirement Plan was established and made available for all Company employees twenty-one years of age having earned \$5,000 during any two preceding years. The Company makes a matching contribution up to 3% of each participant's elective deferrals, not to exceed statutory limitations. The Company's matching contributions were \$39,215 and \$40,000 for the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, respectively.

The Company adopted this new guidance utilizing the modified retrospective transition method. Topic 326 requires measurement and recognition of expected versus incurred losses for financial assets held. Financial assets held by the Company that are subject to ASU 2016-13 include trade accounts receivable.

The cumulative effect of initially applying the new credit loss standard to its contract receivables was immaterial to the opening balance of retained earnings. Results for reporting periods beginning after January 1, 2023 are presented under ASC 326. The Comparative information has not been restated and continues to be reported under the accounting standards in effect in those reporting periods.

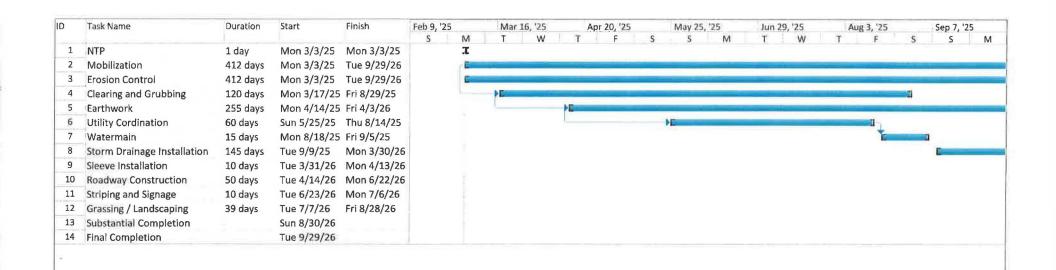

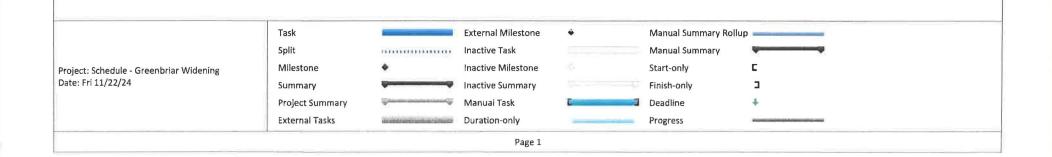

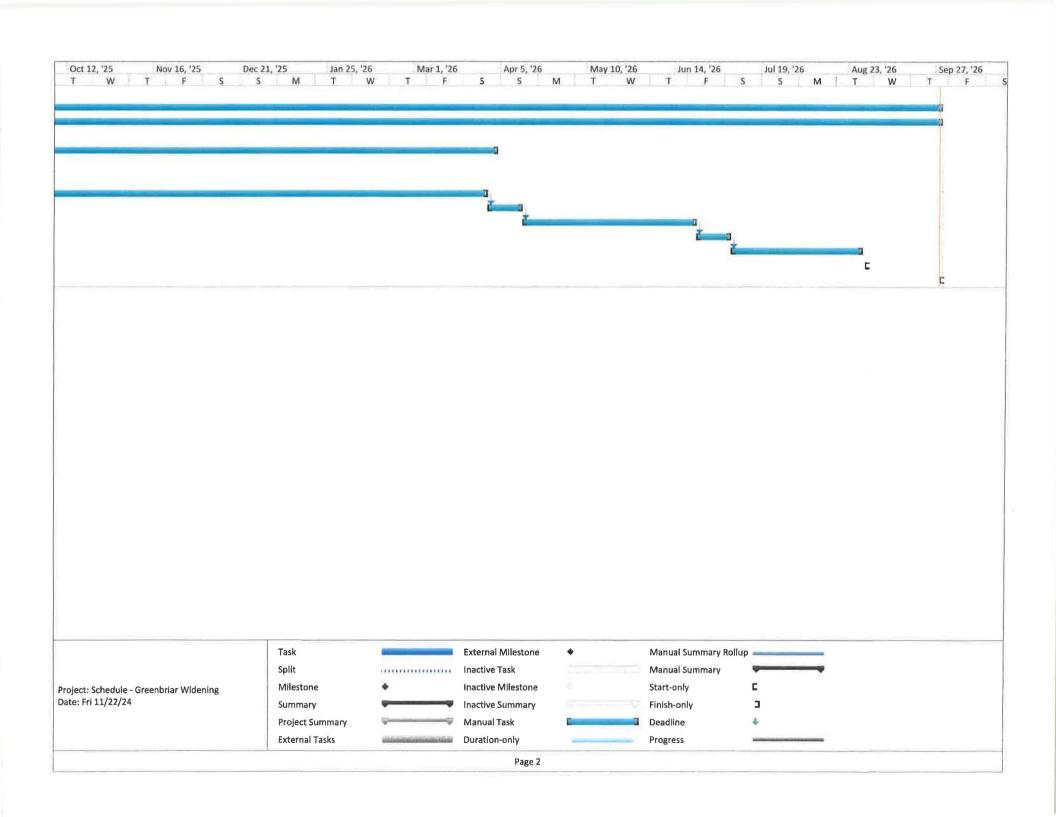

### 1. PRELIMINARY REQUIREMENTS (Pass / Fail)

An interested firm must (i) hold all required local, state and federal licenses in good standing, (ii) be authorized to do business in St. Johns County and the State of Florida, (iii) Proposer or its principals will have constructed three (3) projects similar in quality and scope with a minimum of \$10,000,000 in total volume construction cost within the last five (5) years; (iv) Proposer will have minimum bonding capacity of \$20,000,000 from a surety company acceptable to the District.

### 2. PRICE (60 Points Possible)

This category addresses overall pricing for the construction work, as well as consideration of unit prices and the overall reasonableness of the pricing. Points available for price will be allocated as follows:

**45 Points** will be awarded to the Proposer submitting the lowest cost proposal for completing the work. All other Proposers will receive a percentage of this amount based upon the difference between the Proposer's bid and the low bid.

15 Points are allocated for the reasonableness of unit prices and balance of bid.

### 3. PERSONNEL & EQUIPMENT (10 Points Possible)

This category addresses the following criteria: skill set and experience of key management and assigned personnel, including the project manager and other specifically trained individuals who will manage the Project; experience of key management and assigned personnel performing projects in Duval and St. Johns Counties; present ability to staff, equip and manage the Project; proposed staffing levels; proposed equipment; capability of performing the work; geographic location; inventory of all equipment; etc.

### 4. EXPERIENCE (10 Points Possible)

This category addresses past & current record and experience of the Proposer (and/or subcontractors and suppliers) in similar projects; past & current record and experience of the Proposer (and/or subcontractors and suppliers) in Duval and St. Johns Counties; past performance in any other contracts; etc.

### 5. SCHEDULE (20 Points Possible)

This category addresses the timeliness of the construction schedule, as well as the Proposer's ability to credibly complete the Project within the Proposer's schedule. Points available for schedule will be allocated as follows:

**10 Points** will be awarded to the Proposer submitting the proposal with the most expedited construction schedule (i.e., the fewest number of days) for completing the work. All other proposals will receive a percentage of this amount based upon the difference between the Proposer's time proposal and the most expedited construction schedule.

10 Points are allocated for the Proposer's ability to credibly complete the project within the Proposer's schedule and demonstrate on-time performance.
